An innovative series that will help children see past differences, learn acceptance and understanding and the discovery that we're all pretty much the same at heart. The show's host, James Sullivan is the script writer, filmmaker and editor. Jonathan Murphy performs the character voices for the Bluebee Pal co-hosts. Both of these talented young men are on the autism spectrum.

Each episode comes with an episode guide for educators and parents who wish to delve deeper into a particular topic. Presented by Kayle Concepts, Bluebee Pals, Geek Club Books autism charity, and Quality Services for the Autism Community (QSAC), Bluebee TeeVee Autism Information Station is available for free.
